COUNCIL

TALK ON CAVES AND GULLIES OF BARBADOS

At the last General Meeting a most interesting talk on the Caves and Gullies of Barbados was given by Mr. Ole Sorenson. It was illustrated by colour slides and actual stalactites from the caves which Mr. Sorenson, with the help of the Barbados National Trust, had discovered in Barbados. The Council wishes to thank Mr. Sorenson for his very informative and stimulating talk.

JOURNAL

The Council is most grateful to Mr. Peter Campbell, a Member of Council, for continuing the editorship of the Journal.

LECTURE SERIES

Several series of lectures were organised by the President and

Miss Sheppard, a Member of Council.

The first series, extending from September 1974 to July 1975, was entitled "Aspects of the History of Barbados". Mr. Peter Campbell took a 'Fresh Look at Early Constitutional Developments in Barbados', Professor Arnold Sio spoke on 'The Free Coloured of Barbados and Jamaica', Dr. Woodville Marshall on 'The Plantation Tenantry System in Barbados', Dr. Elsie Payne on 'The Educational System in Barbados'; Hon. H.A. Vaughan then dealt in two lectures with the lives of John Beckles and James Sarsfield Bascom; Mr. A. DeVere Phillips continued on 'Personalities and Principles in Barbadian Politics 1880 - 1914'; Miss Jill Sheppard discussed 'Indentured Servants in Barbados in the Seventeenth Century'; Mr. Warren Alleyne 'Here and There in Early Bridgetown'; and Mr. Ronald Hughes 'Social History from Wills: 1680-1780'.

The next series, "Church and Society in Barbados", was arranged in commemoration of the founding of the See of Barbados. In three lectures, held in October and November 1975 and January 1976, Dr. Keith Hunte dealt with the period immediately preceding this event in 'Church and Society in Early Barbados', Rev. Seon Goodridge spoke on 'Bishop Coleridge and Social Action' and Rev.

Kortright Davis on 'The Mitchinson Era; its Significance'.

The third series, "Institutions of Barbados", took place between March and July 1976. Mr. Carlisle Burton lectured on 'The Barbados Civil Service — 1966 and all that', Mr. Erskine Ward on 'The Sugar Industry', Mr. Justice Williams on 'The Law in Barbados', Mr. John Wickham on 'BIM' and Colonel J. Connell on 'The Barbados Regiment'.

It is intended to continue to organise lectures at the Museum as part of an attempt to encourage greater involvement by the community in the activities of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society.

PRESENTATION OF PORTRAIT OF GEORGE WASHINGTON February 22nd 1974

With a short address the former Ambassador of the U.S. to Barbados Miss Eileen Donovan, presented a portrait of George Washington to the Museum. This was to commemorate the visit of George Washington to Barbados in 1751, in company with his invalid half-brother, Major Lawrence Washington. The picture is a fine framed reproduction in colour of the "Vaughan" portrait by Gilbert Stuart. The original hangs in the National Gallery in Washington. Barbados was the only country outside the United States visited by George Washington and the Museum is very pleased to have this picture.

DIRECTOR'S TRIP TO AMERICA

The Council wished to thank the United States Embassy in Barbados for recommending the Director for a tour of Museums in the United States, sponsored by the U.S. State Department and for making the necessary arrangements. The Director visited 56 Museums in the major cities of the U.S. from May 2nd to June 7th 1974 and saw much to broaden his concepts.

CROP OVER CONCERTS HELD IN COURTYARD

By permission of the Council two open air concerts were held in the Courtyard of the Museum by the Crop Over Committee of the Ministry of Tourism in June 1975.

The show was crammed with performers and as the elements were kind the crowd again got its money's worth. In fact, the crush at the gate was so great on the first night that a repeat performance had to be announced from the stage. There was a 'Night of Jazz' and a 'Night of Old Favourites', with performers from the entertainment world who had not appeared for many years. The Council wishes to thank the Ministry of Tourism for a donation from the proceeds and all those who contributed in any way to make the evening a success. Encouraged by this response a further series was arranged during Crop Over 1976.

CHINESE EXHIBITION

An Exhibition of Contemporary Paintings from the Republic of China was held in three galleries of the Museum from 26th March to 8th April 1975. It was opened with a reception hosted by H.E. the Ambassador of the Republic of China and Mrs. Stephen Yao and the President of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society and Mrs. H.A. Vaughan.

A wide selection of guests were invited and assembled in the

specially lighted Courtyard for the opening speeches.

This was an International Exhibition of Paintings that had just toured South America. To this was added the Museum's Chinese porcelain assembled and displayed with a large legend in Chinese characters specially written by a member of the Embassy staff. The effect was carried further by lanterns and taped Chinese music.

The Council wishes to thank all those who helped to make the Exhibition a success especially the Government Electrical Engineer for the loan of the public address system.

Over one thousand people visited the Exhibition.

NEW GUIDE BOOK AND REARRANGEMENTS

The Director is compiling a new Guide Book in an effort to list every object in each showcase with an overall description. Visitors may notice that a rearrangement of showcases has been made so that the different cases of objects, china, glass, natural history objects etc. are now grouped together. All the furniture rooms have been rearranged and all the prints in the Cunard Gallery rehung and regrouped.

More space is urgently needed for exhibits to be better displayed and more readily studied and enjoyed.

PRINT REPRODUCTIONS

The Print reproductions continue to be popular with local as well as overseas visitors. It is hoped to have a second porfolio produced in the near future, and that sales will be as encouraging as those of the first set.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL CONFERENCE In Guadeloupe July 1975

The Director represented the Barbados Museum and Historical Society at the 6th Conference of Pre-Columbian Studies held in the Caribbean. On this occasion it was held in Guadeloupe from July 6-12. Papers were read on work being done in the Caribbean and in Central and South America elucidating to a greater extent the migrations of Amerindian peoples and the classification of their remains. Plans are being made to build a Museum in Guadeloupe and form a National Collection. On his way home the Director visited a centre at Fond St. Jacques in Martinique established by the Canadian Government for Pre-Columbian Studies in the Caribbean.

EXHIBITION OF SILVER AND PLATE

Prior to his going on long leave the Director staged an Exhibition of Silver and Silver Plate in the Neville Connell Gallery. Pieces are now on display that had previously been in storage and all is assembled together. The Council is grateful to Miss Hilda Greenidge for cleaning the pieces and to Messrs. Harold & John Bowen for revaluing the entire exhibit for insurance purposes. Iron grills have been fixed to the windows for extra security. A colour scheme of walls and display material has been worked out to enhance the beauty of the silver and silver gilt.

AUDITORS

The Society's Auditors Messrs. Pannell Fitzpatrick & Co. who have so generously given their services in the past announced that as from the financial year 1975-76 they would be forced to make a charge. The Council would like to thank the Auditors for their generous services.

VOLUNTARY HELP

The Council would like to thank Mr. Frank I. Gibbons for his generous help in writing labels for some of the exhibits.

MUSEUM COLLECTIONS FUND

A Cockfighting Chair was purchased from the sale of the late Miss Beatrice Sinckler's effects.

A Lantern used by the now defunct Barbados Government Railway was purchased at an auction sale.

ATTENDANCE

During this period 26,288 persons visited the Museum. This figure breaks down into the following: adults 13,738 children 6,185 and schoolchildren totalling 6,365 from 160 schools.

CHILDREN'S SECTION

Thanks to the Government's continued interest and support a special grant was made available for enlarging the Children's Museum. The former Sugar Gallery was transformed by a new tiled floor, new showcases and a new colour scheme. Suitable exhibits are on display to interest children as well as adults.

OTHER GALLERIES NEEDED

More space is urgently required for a Sugar Gallery, a Military Gallery and an Archaeological Gallery. These are important features of Barbados history and many relics have to remain in storage for the present.


