### COURTYARD

In October 1979 an original open-air entertainment entitled '1627 and All That Sort of Thing' was staged at the Museum for the first time. The entertainment was devised and is run by Hotel Investors Ltd. It consists of an evening of feasting and entertainment with a Bajan buffet dinner complemented by an exciting dance programme depicting the heritage of Barbados and performed by the Yoruba Dancers and the Country Theatre Workshop. Before the entertainment commences guests are invited to tour the Museum and many return for a longer visit during the day. '1627 and All That Sort of Thing' was originally presented on a a once-weekly basis, but proved so popular that it is now staged on two evenings each week. It has brought useful publicity to the Museum and provides a welcome addition to the Museum's revenues. A series of concerts was presented on 23rd February, 15th March and 5th April by the Cecilian Singers by arrangement with Miss Provencal.

A cabaret-type entertainment called "Moods" with Frank Mosbaugh, Carole Kirton-Bishop, Patrick Foster, Dorielle Went and various members of the Cecilian Singers was presented on 27th, 28th, 29th and 30th June.

#### **TALKS**

Mr. and Mrs Philip Maycock gave two lectures during April on the subject of Oriental and European porcelain respectively.

At the Annual General Meeting on 21st February 1980 Lt. Col. gave an illustrated talk on St. Nicholas Abbey, its history and former owners.

#### **DOMINICAN ART SHOW**

An exhibition entitled 'Comtemporary Painters from Dominica' and featuring painting and carvings by four young Dominican artists was staged at the Museum in January. It was organized with the assistance of Mr. Royston Ellis and the Ministry of Education and Culture and was opened by the Minister The Hon. Louis Tull on January 5.

#### **OPEN DAY**

As part of Crop Over Festival 1980 the Barbados Museum and Historical Society held its annual 'Open Day' at the Museum on the 21st June. It featured entertainments for children organised with the help of Olga Lopes-Seale and Anna Adamira, guitar performances by Roger Gibbs and Carl Sylvestor, the Carib Singers Serenaders, an Art Exhibition entitled 'Development without Destruction' organised by the Museum, the CCA and the Keep Barbados Beautiful Committee and concluded with a Sunset Concert with dialect Comedy by the Primcada Theatre and a performance by the Barbados Dance Theatre.

A variety of refreshments was offered and valuable assistance was given by young volunteers from the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme in maintaining security and running the Rachel Pringle Bar.

The Council is grateful to Mr. R.M.R. Hunte, Mr. Alfred Pragnell, Mr. John Bowen, Mrs. Jean Goddard and all those who helped to make the 'Open Day' such a success.

# MR. FUNK'S UNESCO MISSION

Mr. Fred Funk, Taxidermist of the California Academy of Sciences, San Francisco visited Barbados for three months on a UNESCO mission at the invitation of the Government. The purpose of his mission was to repair the Museum's natural history specimens and fill the gaps in the collection of resident and migrant birds. Due to the poor condition of many of the museum's specimens, Mr. Funk's mission involved more work than had originally been anticipated and could not be completed in the time allowed. Mr. Funk hopes to return at a future date to finish the job as well as to assist the Director in setting up a new Natural History display and make arrangements for training a Barbadian national in museum taxidermy.

# APPOINTMENT OF NEW DIRECTOR

Mr. Robert Moss, MA., AMA., has been appointed Director of the Barbados Museum and Historical Society and took up his post on 1st September 1980. Mr. Moss was educated at Lancing College and St. Edmund Hall, Oxford, where he gained an Honours Degree in Modern History. He holds the University of Leicester's Graduate Certificate in Museum Studies and the Diploma of the Museums Association of Great Britain. He is also an Associate of the Museums Association and a Member of the Commonwealth Association of Museums. Mr. Moss was previously on the staff of the City Art Gallery, Manchester, England, where he held the post of Assistant Keeper of Decorative Arts before being appointed Keeper of Heaton Hall, Prestwich, Manchester, the former seat of the Earls of Wilton and now a country house museum administered by the City of Manchester. The President and Council wish to record their gratitude to Miss Jill Sheppard, Executive Director of the Caribbean Conservation Association, and to Mr. Raymond Singleton, former Director of Museum Studies at Leicester University, for the valuable assistance they have given the Society in securing the services of Mr. Moss.

# THE SIR GRANTLEY ADAMS MEMORIAL AWARD

Lady Adams represented the Museum at the 25th Anniversary or the Barbados Mutual Society of New England. At this function she received the Sir Grantley Adams Memorial Award on behalf of Mrs. Christian H. Aall. The Award, a plaque, was sent to the Council to hold for Mrs. Aall and was accompanied by a letter of appreciation from Lady Adams.

# THE COURTYARD RENOVATIONS

The Museum continues to be the beneficiary of the generosity and bounty of the Sample Foundation under the direction of Mrs Aall. The renovated lower Courtyard is the most obvious example of this philanthropy, but there are a number of other donations which Mrs. Aall has made over the past year.

Now she is turning her attention to the renovation of the upper courtyard in which noble task she will have the benefit of the advice and guidance of Miss Barbara Hill.

Mrs. Aall has naturally expressed her disquiet at the prospect of the work on the Courtyard being either destroyed or substantially altered in a short time. I cannot as President, nor can the members of the Council give any legally binding guarantee as to what our successors will do. However, we have agreed to the following and this

is included in this Annual Report for this express purpose.

We, the Council of The Barbados Museum & Historical Society, state unequivocally that we have received the funds from the Sample Foundation as a sacred trust for all Barbadians now and in the future. We undertake to preserve the Museum Courtyard as the heritage of all our people and we appeal to our successors to continue that trust and preserve unchanged and unsullied that inheritance in recogition of our history, and in grateful memory of one whose munificence and generosity has increased the amenities and charm of this Museum.




#### 7. TAXATION
