

# THE BARBADOS MUSEUM AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY

#### REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 1982-1983

The Council has pleasure in presenting its Report on the affairs of the Society for the year 1st May 1982 – 30th April 1983.

#### COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting was held on Friday 7th May 1982.

The Honorary Officers were re-elected. Miss Mab Haskell and Mr. Colin Webster were elected, following the retirement of Mr. Warren Alleyne and Miss Barbara Hill.

Mr. Ronald Hughes resigned as Government Representative on 13th September 1982 and was replaced by Mrs. Atheline Haynes.

#### DEATH OF MISS BARBARA HILL

The Council regrets to report the death of Miss Barbara Hill on February 19th 1983. The previous year Miss Hill had designed and overseen the renovation of the Upper Courtyard. Even after her retirement from the Museum Council she had remained a Member of the Museum Development Committee. The Final Report was greatly influenced by her.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

On 1st May 1982 there were 436 Members.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

During the year 6,111 adults and 1,166 children entered by ticket. There were 20 foreign school visits by 480 school children. There were 54 Barbados school visits by 1,938 children. 11,209 visitors attended 1627.

In addition an unrecorded number of Members will have visited the Museum.

#### **JOURNAL**

Journal Vol. XXXVII No. 1 was published in February 1983. Once again we must express thanks to our able Editor Mr. Peter Campbell.

#### NEWSLETTER

A Newsletter is now issued as well as the Journal. It contains ephemeral news about the Museum and the Society activities edited by the Director. The First three numbers were issued during the year (December 1982, February 1983 and April 1983).

#### **JUBILEE**

The Museum is now about 50 years old. Its precise 50th anniversary is a matter of opinion, but most of the important stages of its foundation occurred in 1933 viz

15th April 1933 Museum Council founded 31st May 1933 Society legally incorporated

21st June 1933 First A.G.M.

1st November 1933 Lease acquired on present

building

The Museum did not, however, open its doors until 7th May 1934.

A Jubilee Committee was set up to publicise the Jubilee and arrange events during 1983.

On Saturday 12th February 1983 the Society held a Reception attended by many Members and Guests, including the Governor General, the Prime Minister and the British High Commissioner.

This was followed by an Evening of Song and Dance on the 12th March 1983 when Members and Guests were entertained by the Cecilian Singers and the Barbados Dance Theatre.

Mrs. Brinkley, whose employment at the Museum ceased at the end of June 1983, spent her last five months compiling a dossier on the Barbados Museum. "The Golden 50" (price \$8.00 to Members, \$10.00 to public). The Society records its appreciation of the valuable work rendered to it and particular mention may be made of the opening of the Challenor Gallery.

#### **EXHIBITIONS**

At the start of the year the Exhibition Gallery still held an exhibition of pictures from the Museum's Reserve Collection, arranged by Mrs. Brinkley.

A Caribbean Conservation Association exhibition of Children's Art "Trees their importance for the Environment" was opened on 25th September 1982 by the Minister of Information and Culture. This remained on view until the 18th November 1982.

From the 27th November 1982 until 20th January 1983 the (former) Hilton Art Group held an exhibition.

Two exhibitions opened on the 12th February, the night of the Jubilee Reception. On display in the Exhibition Gallery was "Naive Painting: Haitian and Other". This exhibition was arranged by Mr. Kenneth Gardner, an Architect who has a long history of service to the Society; it was based mainly on his own collection of Haitian Paintings. This remained on display only until 12th March 1983.

The other exhibition opening on the same day is the "Golden Jubilee Exhibition". This was mounted in the Coronation Gallery, by

Mrs. Brinkley with the help of Mrs. Jean Goddard and the Hon. Secretary, Mr. Mark Hunte. It consists of one or two exhibits from each year's accessions 1933–1982. It will remain on view until the gallery is air-conditioned under the capital works programme — probably October or November 1983.

From 19th March to 16th April 1983 Miss Nancy Swan held an exhibition of her paintings in the Exhibition Gallery.

During the course of the year the Director mounted an exhibition in the waiting room of the Harrison's Cave complex, of the collections of Barbadian archaeology made by Mr. C.N.C. Roach in the 1930's and lent to the caves by the present owner, Mr. Ole Sorensen. This will eventually be replaced by an improved display.

#### REARRANGEMENT OF GALLERIES

The "Challenor" or Military Gallery was arranged during the first half of the year by Mrs. Brinkley. It was officially opened by Colonel Rudyard Lewis of the Barbados Defence Force on the 20th November 1982.

Most of the other galleries were rearranged between June and the Reception on February 12th, by the Director, Mr. David C. Devenish, helped by Mr. David Clarke of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme.

The Jubilee Gallery, formerly a gallery of glass and porcelain etc with no overall theme has been rearranged as a gallery of Barbados local history, covering such subjects as archaeology, slavery, sugar, law and order, medicine and religion.

The Warmington Galleries have been arranged as three period rooms, representing the bedroom, nursery and living room of a plantation house about a century ago.

The Guardroom in the North Block has been opened up to allow access through to the walled garden. It contains a display on old West Indian drinking habits.

The former "Art Room" has been rearranged as a "Wide World Gallery" with displays on Amerindians, Maroons, West Africa and the Far East.

The Connell Gallery is now used to display European Art of all types – pictures, glassware, silverware, enamel, porcelain and carving.

The Drax-Children's Galleries have been partially redisplayed, principally to make them more relevant to Barbados.

These displays are intended to remain through the following financial year, but to be completely restructured during 1984/5.

#### **ACTIVITIES**

In addition to the activities already recorded it should be noted that the show "1627" was held nearly every Thursday and Sunday night throughout the year.

Right at the end of the previous year the Canadian Jazz Group "Genes" held performances at the Museum (14–16–17 April 1982).

The Green Room Players held performances of Shakespeare's "Loves Labour Lost" on 16, 18, 19, 20, 23 and 25 June 1982.

The Venezuelan dance Troupe "Contradanza" gave a performance at the Museum on Friday 3 September 1982.

On Monday 10th January 1983, as part of the one week "23 eme Festival de Musique en Mer" the Music staff of the Mermoz arranged a Bach Concert, principally for passengers on the ship.

#### THE LIBRARY

Following the collapse of part of the ceiling a survey of the Museum Library building was undertaken. We owe a debt of gratitude to Messrs. Parsons for carrying out work beyond the terms of their contract and also to Mr. Chandler and Mr. Queree for all the work put into sorting and reshelving the books.

Subsequently (26/1/83) Mr. Chandler submitted a report in which he stated that the Council must either improve the facilities of the Library greatly or close it down and transfer the books elsewhere.

A sub-Committee was set up consisting of Dr. Allsopp, Mr. St. Hill, Mr. Chandler and Mr. Devenish, this did not, however, report until the following year.

#### MUSEUM DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Museum Development Committee, originally set up in October 1980, produced its Final Report in July 1982.

At that time its Membership consisted of:-

Briefly, the Report proposes the modernisation, improvement and enlargement of the Barbados Museum spread over four stages.

The Council, by a large majority, accepted the Report in principal, but left the question of the precise relationship with the Government (paragraphs 45–46) to be decided by the Membership at the A.G.M.

At the end of 1982 a request for finances to start the implementation of the Plan (a modified form of Stage 1) was requested.

This was subsequently granted. Since the Government Financial year runs from 1st April to 31st March it was technically begun during the last month of the current Museum year.

The Government's offer is as follows:-

\$244,000 to cover specified capital works \$140,000+ to cover the salaries/wages of specified staff, including three new ones:— Assistant Curator (History/Art) Assistant Curator(Natural Sciences) Technical Assistant /Artisan

#### STAFF

The Deputy Director, Miss Alissandra Cummins, was away studying all this year, but returned at the beginning of the following year.

Under the Development Plan the staff are all now paid at rates equivalent to those paid to Government employees. Due to the receipt of an extra Government subvention before the end of the year, it was possible to back date these new rates to August 1982.

It was obviously not possible to implement the new posts until the following financial year.

In the Autumn an application was placed for four Curators under the Peace Corps scheme. Subsequently two, David and Joan Robinson, were appointed in time to start work at the very beginning of the next year (May 1983).
