## **ATTENDANCE**

During the 12 months May 1st to April 30th, 1984, 6,066 adults and 1,254 children entered by ticket. There were 44 foreign school visits by 1,923 children. There were 76 Barbadian school visits by 2,952 children. 16,723 visitors attended "1627 and All That."

In addition an unrecorded number of members will have visited the Museum.

From March 12th, 1984 a photographic Exhibition on Prominent Barbadian Women (in Wide World Gallery).

March 17th to April 16th, 1984, "KAZ GWADLOUP", a photographic Exhibition on West Indian architecture.

#### **ACTIVITIES**

The show "1627 and all that" was held nearly every Thursday and Sunday throughout the year.

Performances of "Marvellous Party" were held on June 23rd, 24th, and 25th, 1983.

Films on Chinese Art and Culture, lent by the Chinese Embassy were shown on July 6th, September 14th, 21st, and 28th, 1983.

# THE BARBADOS MUSEUM AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AT 30TH APRIL, 1984

#### INCORPORATION

The Barbados Museum and Historical Society was incorporated under the Barbados Museum and Historical Society Act, 1933.

#### 2. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a] Basis of accounting

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention; no account has been taken of the effects of inflation.

#### b] Inventory

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined on the specific identification basis.

#### c] Depreciation

No depreciation is provided on the society's fixed assets.

#### d] Subscription income

Subscription income is accounted for on the basis of subscriptions received with no recognition being taken for subscriptions receivable.

#### e] Currency

These financial statements are expressed in Barbados Dollars.

#### f] Investments

Investments are stated at cost.

#### 10. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS' FUND

The Barbados Museum and Historical Society has received grants totalling \$243,993 by the Government of Barbados for improvements and alterations to the Museum building and premises.

The Museum entered into an agreement with the Barbados Government dated 9th April, 1979 for a 4% loan of \$50,000 repayable over a ten year period in half-yearly instalments of interest and principal.

#### 12. TAXATION

The Barbados Museum and Historical Society is a registered benevolent organisation and is therefore exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 4 of the Income Tax Act.

#### 13. CAPITAL COMMITMENTS

The Barbados Museum and Historical Society is committed to leasehold improvements to the museum building and premises totalling \$317,810.
